SMOKING IS PROHIBITED ON TIOGA COUNTY SOLID WASTE PROPERTY EXCEPT FOR DESIGNATED AREAS

### **SCALE RATE**

\$70 per ton

Includes worn out furniture, clothing, toys, carpeting, construction debris (sheet rock, shingles, etc.) and mixed quantities of household waste. There is a minimum fee of \$3.00 to pay by weight over the scale - this covers the first 80 pounds. Each additional 20 pounds costs 70 cents.

### **RESIDENTIAL "BAG" RATE**

\$1 per "Bag"

Household waste (not construction debris). A bag is a bag!!! If you wish to pay by the bag, your waste must be bagged, not canned, or boxed, or loose. The bag must be no larger than 33 gallon clear or see through bag.

### **TIRES**

#### **Scale Rate (TUES - FRI ONLY):**

\$120 per ton. 20 or more tires are required to use the scale rate. If using the **SCALE RATE** you **MUST** make appointment prior to bringing tires in (565-8130, 565-9260, or toll free within 607 area 800-927-2323).

#### **Individual Tire Rate:**

Lawn Tractor (< 6" inside diameter)/Bicycle: No Charge

Motorcycle: \$1.00

4-wheeler/Yard Tractor (> 6" inside diameter): \$2.00

up to 17": \$2.00 add \$1.00 w/rim

17 - 19": \$3.00 add \$1.00 w/rim

19 - 22.5": \$5.00 add \$2.00 w/rim

22.5 - 36": \$8.00 add \$3.00 w/rim

> 36": \$12.00 add \$5.00 w/rim

#### **PLEASENOTE:**

- **Scaled tires must be loaded directly into the tire trailer.**
- **No tires larger than what two people can pick-up**
- **No liquid-balanced tires accepted.**
- **Tires must be drained prior to bringing to the Transfer Station.**

## REFRIGERATORS, FREEZERS and OTHER ITEMS WITH FREON

Report to the Office First. All Refrigerators and Freezers must have the doors removed. All food, bins, and detachable shelves must be removed from these units.

There is a \$10.00 charge for any item that had or has freon such as refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, and dehumidifiers. Placed these items in the designated area.

Freon does **NOT** need to be removed.

## MISCELLANEOUS SERVICES

- **Household Batteries**

Report to Office First.

- **Used Motor Oil**

No Charge, 5 gallons maximum per visit.

- **Fluorescent Bulbs and Light Ballast**

Please report to the Office First. No Charge.

- **SCRAP METAL**

Report to Office First. No Charge, Nothing with glass, ashes or fluids. No propane tanks, copiers, TV's, monitors, etc. If it is mostly plastic it is garbage.

## WHAT TO DO WITH LATEX PAINT?

Latex (or water based) paint, if properly prepared, can be disposed with your regular waste.

**Use one of these methods to prepare latex paint for disposal.**

- Remove lids and let the paint air-dry. This will take time; so keep it out of children and pet's reach. When completely dry, replace lid and put with your waste.
- Mix an absorbent with the paint to make the paint a solid. Sawdust or kitty litter work well. When completely solid, replace lid and put with your waste.

**TIP:** If your waste is picked up from the curb you may want to contact your hauler to let him or her know the paint has been properly prepared for disposal.

**NOTE:** For Oil-based paint see Household Hazardous Waste Program

## PLEASE NOTE:

**Needles** and **syringes** may be placed in a rigid container with the top securely taped closed. Mark "medical waste" on the container and put in the garbage.

**Unwanted Medications** - Return to collection events where available **Or** place in your trash. It is a good idea to disguise the medication, perhaps mix with something undesirable, such as coffee grounds, cat litter or dirt, so that it will not be taken out of the trash by a third party, or pet, and ingested.

Do not dispose of medications down the drain or flush them down the toilet as they may pass through the system and certain items (such as hormone meds, chemotherapy drugs, antibiotics, etc.) may create harmful results in wildlife populations; fish infertility, etc.

**Recyclables** must be separated from your waste according to the Mandatory Source Separation law of August 1992. Direct any recycling questions to our staff. **Loads of garbage with recycling mixed in may be rejected.**

Use a **TARP** if there is any way something may be lost during transport you are at risk of a fine.

**Prohibited Materials:** lead-acid batteries, friable asbestos, hazardous waste, liquid waste, yard waste, sludges, explosives, hot ashes, refillable propane tanks.

**Yard Waste** is not accepted at the Transfer Station. Contact your Town Clerk for information about yard waste collections.
