Digital Marketing Campaign

TCT has contracted with Mulitiview to implement a digital marketing campaign that will target overnight drive areas such as Buffalo, Scranton an out-of-state metropolitan areas such as Cleveland and Philadelphia using specific demographics such as age, interest etc...

Susquehanna Heritage Area

An Arts and Cultural Master Plan that will inform the updating of the current SHA Management Plan has begun. A consultant has been agreed upon by both Broome and Tioga Counties.

TC Visitor Center

The new restaurant in the Visitor Center is doing very well. We are seeing triple the number of visitors and foot traffic, giving out more brochures and interacting with more people from out-of-town than ever before.

Owego First Friday

Owego First Fridays are back on the upswing, so we have been staying open a little later. We have had some great exhibits recently that have been very well received by the public.

The Southern Tier Beverage Trail is expanding to include Owego Beer and Donuts and Owego Brewing. A new campaign is being developed. TCT will coordinate a meeting with local participants to discuss how we can ensure Tioga is at the forefront.



SWCD REPORT August 2025

AGRICULTURE PROGRAM:

- The District has several Ag Nonpoint Source Pollution Control grant contracts that are in closeout phase (2). One active contract we completed riparian forest buffer planting on this spring and then just need to finish up a waterline installation and that grant will be ready for closeout. Two active contracts with Climate Resilient Farming (CRF) grant funding that will support 2 farms with cover crop implementation and promote the District's growing soil health program. In progress
- We submitted 3 applications to Rd 30 AGNPS grant, 2 implementation and 1 planning grant. Applications involved 5 farms. Update: we received 2 of the 3 grants and are working on the plan of work submittal.
- We will be submitting a CRF application for Rd 9 when released this spring/summer. Waiting on RFP release.
- Tioga CCE project construction is underway. We are constructing two stormwater ponds at their facility this summer that will hold back a 100 year storm event providing flood mitigation to the downstream watershed, in addition we will be creating a wetland complex and planting 12 acres of riparian forest buffer.
- We are currently working on our Agricultural Environmental Management Program. We plan to work on 4 Best Management implementation projects and support 7 farms with buffer establishment over the next 2 years. 2 of the implementation projects have been completed installation of a VTA and a manure storage closure has been completed.
- We hired 2 buffer stewards, they are working on monitoring and maintaining all buffers in the County that the District has been involved in planting. They have completed 135 acres on 56 different sites.

HAZARD MITIGATION:

Working under the County contract, support hazard mitigation work, attending Village of Owego Climate Smart Community steering committee. Assisted the Village of Owego with a submittal of a planning grant to look at stormwater runoff at the Evergreen Cemetery. Also submitting a planning grant for Owego Creek Watershed Assessment, and 2 implementation projects.

STORMWATER:

- We continue to review Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plans for one of our municipalities that is an MS4 community. Currently reviewing solar site on Montrose Turnpike.
- SWCD staff sat through training by NYSDEC on solar requirements for the General Construction Permit.

STREAM PROGRAM:

We continue to provide permit and design assistance to Landowner's and municipalities when it comes to stream work.

- Completed Blodgett Road stream rehabilitation project.
- Assisting the Village and Town of Newark Valley with permitting and technical assistance after the July 13th rain event, along with numerous private landowners.
- WQIP application for a stream restoration project on W. Branch Owego Creek was approved; waiting on state to complete contract.
- Assisting Trout Unlimited with their Owego Creek Watershed Assessment by conducting culvert assessments within the watershed.

AUTHORIZE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND PLANNING TO SUBMIT APPLICATION FOR NYS CDBG IMMINENT THREAT PROGRAM AND AUTHORIZE LEGISLATIVE CHAIR SIGNATURE ON GRANT RELATED DOCUMENTS

WHEREAS: The Tioga County Property Development Corporation intends to demolish two structures that pose an imminent threat to health and welfare of the community located on Railroad Avenue, Berkshire and Hickory Park Road, Owego; and

WHEREAS: The Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program is administered by the NYS Office of Community Renewal (OCR), and will make available to eligible local governments approximately \$40,000,000 in the CDBG Public Infrastructure, Public Facility, Community Planning, Economic Development, and Imminent Threat programs; and

WHEREAS: The Imminent Threat program is designed to address urgent and unforeseen threats to public health and safety that require immediate action, including environmental remediation and demolition/property clearance; and

WHEREAS: Tioga County is proposing the submittal of an application under the CDBG Imminent Threat program in the amount of \$200,000 to assist the Tioga County Property Development Corporation with the aforementioned project; and

WHEREAS: The proposed project is an eligible activity under the CDBG Imminent Threat program and Tioga County, NY, as a non-entitlement unit of local government, is an eligible entity to apply for and receive CDBG funds; and

WHEREAS: This grant source, administered by the NYS Office of Community Renewal requires no local match; and

WHEREAS: Per Resolution 237-25, a Public Hearing was held July 24, 2025, and no comments were received; therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Tioga County Legislature authorizes said grant application in the amount of \$200,000 and upon award authorizes the Chair of the Legislature to sign any and all grant-related contract and other paperwork, contingent upon review by the County Attorney.

REVISE AND MODIFY ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF TIOGA & THE TIOGA COUNTY INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY FOR OCTOBER 1, 2025 THROUGH

DECEMBER 31, 2026

WHEREAS: The County of Tioga approved by Resolution No. 65-25 entering into an Administrative Services Agreement with the Tioga County Industrial Development Agency (TCIDA) for the period January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025; and
