**Instructions**

1. Mark only with a writing instrument provided by the board of elections.
2. To vote for a candidate whose name is printed on this ballot, fill in the oval next to the name of the candidate.
3. To vote for a person whose name is not printed on this ballot, write or stamp his or her name in the space labelled "Write-In" that appears at the bottom of the candidate names for such office.

4. Any other mark or writing, or any erasure made on this ballot outside the voting square or blank spaces provided for voting will void this entire ballot.
5. Do not overvote. You may vote only for the maximum number of candidates for each office. The maximum number of candidates you may vote for in each office is listed at the top of the column for that office. Casting more votes than the maximum number allowed in any contest, will void your votes for that contest only.

6. If you tear, deface or wrongly mark this ballot, return it to a poll worker and obtain another. Do not attempt to correct mistakes on the ballot by making erasures or cross-outs. Erasures or cross-outs may invalidate all or part of your ballot. Prior to submitting your ballot, if you make a mistake in completing the ballot or wish to change your ballot choices, you may obtain and complete a new ballot. You have a right to a replacement ballot upon the return of the original ballot.
7. After completing your ballot, insert it into the ballot scanner and wait for the notice that your ballot has been successfully scanned. If no such notice appears, seek the assistance of an election inspector.
