NOTEWORTHY ITEMS, UPDATES AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

1/23/23-2/22/23

- Dan Scherrer, presented information at the Council of Governments and at the Village of Newark Valley on the state expectations for Lead and Copper Service Line Replacements, as well as the Wellhead Replacement Grant.
- (34) ATUPA (Adolescent Tobacco Use Prevention Act) Checks were conducted at tobacco retailers around the county. There was (1) violation for underage sales to a minor.
- There was a substantial increase in Early Intervention referrals this month at 21; with 16 children waiting for services, as one agency closed.
- 5 car seats were distributed. Caregivers were supplied with a new seat, shown how to properly install the seat and demonstrated their understanding. 1 seat out of the 5 was installed incorrectly; while the other four were new seats. One family was a referral from Early Intervention.
- Of the (64) one- and two-year-olds that were tested for elevated blood lead levels (EBLL) (a threshold of 5.0 micrograms per deciliter or higher) ZERO had EBLL. This is the first time in several years. We currently follow a caseload of 14 children with EBLL.
- (2) Narcan replacement kits were distributed through the Opioid Overdose Prevention Program
- Nearly 85% of individuals seen on the dental unit have some amount of dental decay; with 22% high decay


